(l) QUESTION PERIOD

The Hon. Zane J. S. DeSilva, Minister of Housing and Municipalities, to provide Written Response to Parliamentary Questions from the Hon. Michael A. Fahy:

1. On 26th June 26 the Honourable Minister Zane DeSilva. undertook to share with this Honourable House the “rigorous technical and procurement evaluation” conducted by the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (“AHAC”) before certain contracts were given out to Coastal Precast Systems and Preconco Ltd. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the procurement methodology document(s) and detail the rigorous technical and procurement evaluation utilized by the Bermuda Housing Corporation (“BHC”)/Bermuda Land Management Company (“BLMC”)/AHAC for the purposes of evaluating proposals made for the projects listed in the Minister’s statement to this Honorable House on 26th June 2026?
2. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with a full listing of all proposals received and considered by the AHAC for the developments at Morgan’s Point, Victoria Place and Albert Row and Tommy Fox Road to which the Minister referred in his statement of 26th June 2026 to this Honourable House? Including (i) the name of the entities that made proposals, (ii) date(s) the proposal(s) was/were considered by the AHAC, (iii) the overall number of units that the entity was proposing to build, (iv) the cost per square foot of each unit in the proposal(s), and (v) the reason(s) each proposal was either recommended for acceptance or rejection by the AHAC?
3. A statement released to the media dated 21 July 2026, by the Ministry of Housing and Municipalities said, “Following the technical assessment, Committee representatives visited the manufacturing facilities of some vendors to conduct direct evaluations of completed housing installations utilizing the proposed systems, including an on-site inspection of capsule housing units in use to assess performance under actual occupancy and environmental conditions. This formed part of the Committee’s broader due diligence process prior to making its recommendations.” Will the Honourable Minister please advise this Honourable House of (i) the names of each manufacturer visited by AHAC representatives and/or the Minister, (ii) the date of the visits to the manufacturer by AHAC representatives and/or the Minister, (iii) the identity of the representatives of the manufacturer that the AHAC representatives and/or the Minister met, and (iv) the costs of all travel expenses incurred by BHC/AHAC/BLMC/the Ministry of Housing and Municipalities to attend the meetings with the said manufacturers?

The Hon. Jache A. K. Adams, Minister of Public Works and Environment, to provide Oral Response to Parliamentary Questions from Ms. Linda C. Smith:

- *1. Will the Honourable Minister please inform this Honourable House as to the size and composition of the original Climate Change Taskforce that was announced as having been established in 2021 by the former minister responsible for the environment?
- *2. Will the Honourable Minister please inform this Honourable House what were the terms of the financial compensation provided to Members of the Climate Change Taskforce over the course of their tenure?

- *3. Will the Honourable Minister please inform this Honourable House how is the Bermuda Climate Change report, sponsored by the British Government in 2022 and released in 2024, being used by Government to help inform decisions on risk mitigation, specifically the threat of erosion to shoreline developments, existing and new?

- *1. Will the Honourable Minister please explain to this Honourable House how the \$440,000 that he had announced was invested in the Carnival Cruise Ship visits was broken down and allotted to different organizations and service providers?
- *2. Considering that he had initially estimated there would be approximately \$1.2 million in return or thereabouts, will the Honourable Minister please explain to this Honourable House whether he is now prepared to provide more definitive numbers for the return on the \$440,000 investment and how much that would be?

The Hon. O. K. Darrell, Minister of Tourism and Transport, Culture and Sport, to provide Written Response to Parliamentary Questions from the Hon. Ben A. Smith:

1. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the most recent condition assessment of every facility, building, sporting surface, system and major asset at the National Sports Centre, stating for each the date it was last assessed or inspected, its current condition, and any maintenance, repair or replacement that has been identified as necessary?
2. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the estimated cost of every outstanding maintenance, repair or replacement identified as necessary across the National Sports Centre, stating for each item the estimated cost, whether funding has been allocated, the amount allocated and, where funding has not been allocated, the amount still required?
3. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the planned schedule for every outstanding maintenance, repair or replacement identified across the National Sports Centre, stating for each item its priority, anticipated commencement date, anticipated completion date and whether the affected facility or asset will remain fully operational while the work is undertaken?

The Hon. O. K. Darrell, Minister of Tourism and Transport, Culture and Sport, to provide Written Response to Parliamentary Questions from the Hon. L. Craig Cannonier:

1. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the total cost of the solar energy project installed at the National Sports Centre, including a breakdown of the original contract value, any subsequent variations or additional expenditure, the names of all contractors and subcontractors engaged on the project, and the amount paid to each as of the date of this response?
2. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the total electricity generated by the National Sports Centre solar energy system, measured in kilowatt-hours, for each month since the system became operational, together with the projected electricity generation for each corresponding month and details of any period during which the system was partially or fully non-operational?
3. Will the Honourable Minister please provide this Honourable House with the National Sports Centre's electricity expenditure for the financial year immediately preceding the solar energy system becoming operational and for each financial year thereafter, together with the total value of electricity savings or credits attributable to the solar project to date and the original projected annual financial savings and payback period for the project?
