Young Offenders PRT

Damaged Property – April 25th ... asked ... to do his assigned morning chores of his cell/unit, however ... refused. During this time, ... broke the unit broom in his cell and then threw the broken pieces into the hallway. He was given a three-day lockdown for his disruptive behavior and refusal to follow instructions.

Damaged Property – April 25th during a Night Patrol observation check, officers observed ... breaking his toilet seat into pieces.

Unauthorized Article – April 29th during a search in Section A PRT, cell #27, which is housed by ... officers discovered a shank made from a broken inmate issued cup. ... was informed that he would be placed on charge for possession of an unauthorized article. The shank was retained as evidence. ... was spoken with to ascertain if there were any underlying issues contributing to this behavior.

Damaged Property – Incident involving ... that occurred April 30th. After being informed by the unit officer that he couldn't have soy sauce with his meal, ... became agitated and tossed his meal tray on the floor. The situation escalated, leading to further damage. ... proceeded to break his cell door observation window, the toilet seat, and the meal tray. Due to his behavior Officers immediately intervened to prevent further destruction. Informed that he is on charge for the property damage and disruptive behavior.

Duress activated – Incident that occurred May 1st in the PTR involving ... requested to submit an application for a Form 9. He was advised by the Unit Officers that he could not submit the application due to him being on Loss of Privileges. This restriction led to his frustration, and he began breaking up personal items in his cell. Officers activated their duress and had to physically restrain him to prevent further damage and ensure safety. ... was moved to Segregation, where he could be isolated to calm down and avoid causing more destruction.

Discharge – Remand [redacted] discharged 9th May - released to the staff of Dignity House which is a treatment facility for recovering addicts.

MAINTENANCE / DEFECTS

Works & Engineering- May 2nd [redacted] in to the Facility to work on the installation of sinks in Section A. Completed installation of cells 31, 32 and 33. Will return to the facility to conduct repairs to further cells, currently waiting on parts.

Water Deliveries-Works and Engineering and [redacted] : continue to deliver water to the facility Section C tank, as needed.

Filtration System – April 24th [redacted] attended the facility regarding the recent water filtration system installation and completed connecting it. [redacted] was contacted after several complaints from staff and inmates about the water tasting overly chlorinated. As a safety measure, bottled water was issued to the inmate population. The facility water is now deemed drinkable and is not overly chlorinated.

Works & Engineering –May 1st a major plumbing ceiling leak in the Section D hallway, caused by a pinhole in the copper hot water pipe. Works and Engineering, [redacted] and [redacted] attended the facility and placed a C-clamp with rubber on the pipe to stop the leak temporarily. – May 3rd plumbers [redacted] and [redacted] in the facility to conduct repairs to the hot water copper pipe in the Section A Segregation area. To facilitate the repairs it required shutting off the hot water supply.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Staff Shortages-The facility continues to experience staff shortages but manages to cover these deficiencies by reallocation of staff.

Antigen Testing-Testing for the facility has returned to once on Monday's for staff. All visitors and vendors are still required to antigen test upon entry to the facility.

Mask Wearing-Mask wearing in the facility is optional within the facility.

Reflective Practice-Reflective Practice sessions with [redacted] continues with all staff. Senior staff is facilitated every first Tuesday, RLH staff is held every second Wednesday and Basic Officers is held every third and fourth Wednesday. Staff continue to enjoy the opportunity to gain insight into how to improve themselves and the work environment at the Co-Ed facility.

Pin Phones Operational – April 23rd staff [redacted] and [redacted] attended the facility and advised that a technician would have to attend the facility to troubleshoot the issue with the Pin Phone not working in Section A. Two (2) inmates still have outstanding funds owed due to department error.
