The Minister responsible for marine and ports services, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10(1)(aa) and (b) of the Marine Board Act 1962, issues the following Notice:

Citation

This Notice may be cited as the Marine Board (Control Over Maritime Traffic) (No. 2) Notice 2013.

Interpretation

In this Notice, "George's Bay" means the body of water named George's Bay on UK Admiralty Chart 332 and located at the western end of the southern shoreline of Morgan's Point (formerly the United States Naval Annex).

Closure of George's Bay

George's Bay will be closed to marine traffic until further notice to permit environmental remediation and demolition works to occur within the vicinity of the shoreline, as such works are considered potentially hazardous to vessels and crew.

Marking of Closure at George's Bay

- George's Bay will be marked closed by—
 - (a) appropriate signage placed on either shoreline; and
 - (b) a buoy with flashing amber light positioned in the middle of a series of red buoys crossing the mouth of the Bay.

Patrol of George's Bay

5 The mouth of George's Bay will be patrolled by Government vessels and all mariners, pilots and boatmen are required to keep clear of, or exercise caution when approaching, the Bay.

Exemption from this Notice

6 A pilot or boatman shall not enter George's Bay without written consent of the Director of Marine and Ports.
