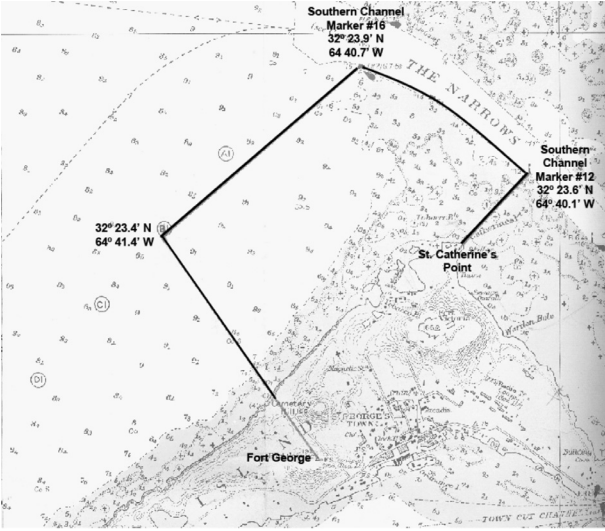

<b>FISHERIES ACT 1972</b> <b>NOTICE ISSUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 4A OF THE FISHERIES ACT 1972</b>

TAKE NOTICE that the Minister responsible for the Environment, being satisfied that there is an immediate need for the prohibition of fishing in a fish aggregation area, for the conservation and protection of the Blue-striped grunt (*Haemulon sciurus*) hereby notifies all members of the public that fishing in the fish aggregation area described below is prohibited from 1st May 2013 through 30th June 2013:

The area, being roughly rectangular in shape, enclosed by a line running in a north-easterly direction from St. Catherine's Point, St. George's to the Southern channel marker #12 (32 degrees 23.6 minutes North, 64 degrees 40.1 minutes West) thence by a line running along the southern boundary of the Southern channel to the Southern channel marker #16 (32 degrees 23.9 minutes North, 64 degrees 40.7 minutes West) thence by a line running in a south-westerly direction to a point 32 degrees 23.4 minutes North, 64 degrees 41.4 minutes West thence by a line running in a south-easterly direction to Fort George, St. George's.

<b>FISHERIES (PROTECTED AREAS) AMENDMENT ORDER 2013</b>
<b>BR 38/2013</b>
The Minister responsible for fisheries, in exercise of the power conferred by section 4 of the Fisheries Act 1972, makes the following Order:
<b>Citation</b>
1 This Order which amends the Fisheries (Protected Areas) Order 2000 (“the principal Order”) may be cited as the Fisheries (Protected Areas) Amendment Order 2013.
<b>Amends paragraph 3 (Prohibited activities)</b>
2 Paragraph 3(2)(a) of the principal Order is revoked and replaced with the following—
“(a) “South Western Area” being roughly rectangular in shape, is the area enclosed: from the Northern Point (32 degrees 16.4 minutes North, 65 degrees 3.2 minutes West) by a line running in a south-easterly direction to the Eastern Point (32 degrees 16.1 minutes North, 65 degrees 0 minutes West) thence by a line running in a south-easterly direction to the Southern Point (32 degrees 11.9 minutes North, 64 degrees 57.1 minutes West) thence by a line running in a south-westerly direction to the Western Point (32 degrees 11.0 minutes North, 65 degrees 0 minutes West): and on the Seaward margin by the 200 metre contour.”.”.

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The Minister responsible for intellectual property, in exercise of the power conferred by sections 38 and 39 of the Trade Marks Act 1974, makes the following Regulations:

**Citation**  
1 These Regulations, which amend the Trade Marks and Service Marks Regulations 1993 (the “principal Regulations”) may be cited as the Trade Marks and Service Marks Amendment Regulations 2013.

**Amends regulation 4**  
2 Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is amended—

- in paragraph (1) by deleting the words “or Fifth” and substituting “, Fifth or Sixth”;
- in paragraph (2)—
  - by deleting the words “on or after 1st July 1975 but before 13 November 2009” and substituting “1 May 2013”; and
  - by inserting after “Fifth Schedule” the words “or Part I of the Sixth Schedule”;
- in paragraph (3)—
  - by deleting the words “on or after 19th June 1993 but before 13 November 2009” and substituting “before 1 May 2013”; and
  - by inserting after “Fifth Schedule” the words “or Part II of the Sixth Schedule”; and
- in paragraph (4)—
  - by deleting the words “13 November 2009” and substituting “1 May 2013”; and
  - by deleting the word “Fifth” and substituting “Sixth”.

**Amends regulation 5**  
3 Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations is amended—

- in paragraph (1)—
  - by deleting the words “or Fourth” and substituting “Fourth or Fifth”; and
  - by deleting the words “or Fifth” and substituting “Fifth or Sixth”; and
- in paragraph (3) by deleting the words “or Fifth” and substituting “Fifth or Sixth”.

**Amends regulation 19**  
4 Regulation 19(1) of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting the word “Fifth” and substituting “Sixth”.

**Amends regulation 20**  
5 Regulation 20(3) of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting the word “Fifth” and substituting “Sixth”.

**Amends regulation 93**  
6 Regulation 93(1) of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting the words “or Fifth” and substituting “Fifth or Sixth”.

**Inserts Sixth Schedule**  
7 The principal Regulations are amended by inserting, after the Fifth Schedule, the Sixth Schedule as set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

**Commencement**  
8 These Regulations come into operation on 1 May 2013.

<b>“SIXTH SCHEDULE</b>

<b>CLASSIFICATION OF GOODS AND SERVICES</b>
<b>PART I - GOODS</b>

**Class 1**  
Chemicals used in industry, science and photography, as well as in agriculture, horticulture and forestry; unprocessed artificial resins, unprocessed plastics; manures; fire extinguishing compositions; tempering and soldering preparations; chemical substances for preserving foodstuffs; tanning substances; adhesives used in industry.

**Class 2**  
Paints, varnishes, lacquers; preservatives against rust and against deterioration of wood; colorants; mordants; raw natural resins; metals in foil and powder form for painters, decorators, printers and artists.

**Class 3**  
Bleaching preparations and other substances for laundry use; cleaning, polishing, scouring and abrasive preparations; soaps; perfumery, essential oils, cosmetics, hair lotions; dentifrices.

**Class 4**  
Industrial oils and greases; lubricants; dust absorbing, wetting and binding compositions; fuels (including motor spirit) and illuminants; candles and wicks for lighting.

**Class 5**  
Pharmaceutical and veterinary preparations; sanitary preparations for medical purposes; dietetic food and substances adapted for medical or veterinary use, food for babies; dietary supplements for humans and animals; plasters, materials for dressings; material for stopping teeth, dental wax; disinfectants; preparations for destroying vermin; fungicides herbicides.

**Class 6**  
Common metals and their alloys; metal building materials; transportable buildings of metal; materials of metal for railway tracks; non-electric cables and wires of common metal; ironmongery, small items of metal hardware; pipes and tubes of metal; safes; goods of common metal not included in other classes; ores.

**Class 7**  
Machines and machine tools; motors and engines (except for land vehicles); machine coupling and transmission components (except for land vehicles); agricultural implements other than hand-operated; incubators for eggs; automatic vending machines.

**Class 8**  
Hand tools and implements (hand-operated); cutlery; side arms; razors.

**Class 9**  
Scientific, nautical, surveying, photographic, cinematographic, optical, weighing, measuring, signalling, checking (supervision), life-saving and teaching apparatus and instruments; apparatus and instruments for conducting, switching, transforming, accumulating, regulating or controlling electricity; apparatus for recording, transmission or reproduction of sound or images; magnetic data carriers, recording discs; compact discs, DVDs and other digital recording media; mechanisms for coin-operated apparatus; cash registers, calculating machines, data processing equipment, computers; computer software; fire-extinguishing apparatus.

**Class 10**  
Surgical, medical, dental and veterinary apparatus and instruments, artificial limbs, eyes and teeth; orthopedic articles; suture materials.

**Class 11**  
Apparatus for lighting, heating, steam generating, cooking, refrigerating, drying, ventilating, water supply and sanitary purposes.

**Class 12**  
Vehicles; apparatus for locomotion by land, air or water.

**Class 13**  
Firearms; ammunition and projectiles; explosives; fireworks.

**Class 14**  
Precious metals and their alloys and goods in precious metals or coated therewith, not included in other classes; jewellery, precious stones; horological and chronometric instruments.

**Class 15**  
Musical instruments.

**Class 16**  
Paper, cardboard and goods made from these materials, not included in other classes; printed matter; bookbinding material; photographs; stationery; adhesives for stationery or household purposes; artists' materials; paint brushes; typewriters and office requisites (except furniture); instructional and teaching material (except apparatus); plastic materials for packaging (not included in other classes); printers' type; printing blocks.

**Class 17**  
Rubber, gutta-percha, gum, asbestos, mica and goods made from these materials and not included in other classes; plastics in extruded form for use in manufacture; packing, stopping and insulating materials; flexible pipes, not of metal.

**Class 18**  
Leather and imitations of leather, and goods made of these materials and not included in other classes; animal skins, hides; trunks and travelling bags; umbrellas and parasols; walking sticks; whips, harness and saddlery.

**Class 19**  
Building materials (non-metallic); non-metallic rigid pipes for building; asphalt, pitch and bitumen; non-metallic transportable buildings; monuments, not of metal.

**Class 20**  
Furniture, mirrors, picture frames; goods (not included in other classes) of wood, cork, reed, cane, wicker, horn, bone, ivory, whalebone, shell, amber, mother-of-pearl, meerschaum and substitutes for all these materials, or of plastics.

**Class 21**  
Household or kitchen utensils and containers; combs and sponges; brushes (except paint brushes); brush-making materials; articles for cleaning purposes; steel wool; un-worked or semi-worked glass (except glass used in building); glassware, porcelain and earthenware not included in other classes.

**Class 22**  
Ropes, string, nets, tents, awnings, tarpaulins, sails, sacks and bags (not included in other classes); padding and stuffing materials (except of rubber or plastics); raw fibrous textile materials.

**Class 23**  
Yarns and threads, for textile use.

**Class 24**  
Textiles and textile goods, not included in other classes; bed covers; table covers.

**Class 25**  
Clothing, footwear, headgear.

**Class 26**  
Lace and embroidery, ribbons and braid; buttons, hooks and eyes, pins and needles; artificial flowers.

**Class 27**  
Carpets, rugs, mats and matting, linoleum and other materials for covering existing floors; wall hangings (non-textile).

**Class 28**  
Games and playthings; gymnastic and sporting articles not included in other classes; decorations for Christmas trees.

**Class 29**  
Meat, fish, poultry and game; meat extracts; preserved, frozen, dried and cooked fruits and vegetables; jellies, jams, compotes; eggs; milk and milk products; edible oils and fats.

**Class 30**  
Coffee, tea, cocoa and artificial coffee; rice; tapioca and sago; flour and preparations made from cereals; bread, pastry and confectionery; ices; sugar, honey, treacle; yeast, baking-powder; salt; mustard; vinegar, sauces (condiments); spices; ice.
