The successful applicant will be responsible for the Trust's conservation work and will assist with environmental advocacy. Reporting to the Director of Preservation, the Conservation Officer will be a key player in the Trust's Property Department. The Conservation Officer's responsibilities will principally include:

- Carrying out woodland management within BNT nature reserves;
- Managing conservation and capital projects in BNT open spaces, including budget preparation, compiling Conservation Management Plans, Planning Applications and reporting;
- Managing and developing community volunteer programmes and projects to assist with the above;
- Managing the conservation of cemeteries and memorials under the care of BNT;
- Managing BNT agricultural holdings;
- Organising the Trust's annual Palm Sunday Walk and general assistance with all special events;
- Assisting the Trust's activities in environmental advocacy;
- Management and contribution to the development of interpretation of BNT properties.

The successful candidate will be a self-motivated, team-orientated person who is highly organised. Experience in a comparable role or a tertiary level qualification in horticulture, land management or a related conservation field is required, as well as a proven active interest in Bermuda's natural and historical protection. Horticultural expertise in invasive species control is essential. An understanding of Bermuda's environmental legislation would be an asset. Good written, verbal communication skills and computer skill are essential.

The position is full time; working hours will include some weekend work to suit volunteer projects as required. This is an exciting, wide-ranging job opportunity for an enthusiastic person interested in preserving Bermuda's heritage.
