BERMUDA
PROCEEDS OF CRIME (ANTI-MONEY LAUNDERING AND ANTI-TERRORIST FINANCING) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2014
BR 61 / 2014
The Minister responsible for legal affairs, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 49(3) of the Proceeds of Crime Act 1997 and section 12A of the Anti-Terrorism (Financial and Other Measures) Act 2004, makes the following Regulations:

Citation
1 These Regulations, which amend the Proceeds of Crime (Anti-Money Laundering and Anti-Terrorist Financing) Regulations 2008 (the “principal Regulations”), may be cited as the Proceeds of Crime (Anti-Money Laundering and Anti-Terrorism Financing) Amendment Regulations 2014.

Amends regulation 7
2 Regulation 7 of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting paragraph (2) and substituting the following—

“(2) “Ongoing monitoring” of a business relationship means—

(a) an investigation of transactions undertaken throughout the course of the relationship (including, where necessary, the source of funds) to ensure that the transactions are consistent with the relevant person’s knowledge of the customer, his business and risk profile;

(b) an investigation into the background and purpose of all complex, unusually large transactions, or unusual patters of transactions which have no apparent economic or lawful purpose and record the findings in writing; and

(c) so far as practicable keeping the documents, data, and information obtained (including the findings of paragraph (b) of this paragraph), for the purpose of applying customer due diligence measures up-to-date.”.

Amends regulation 15(5A)
3 Regulation 15(5A) of the principal Regulations is amended by—

(a) inserting next after the words “all documents” the words “and findings”; and

(b) inserting next after the words “five years” the words “to be available for competent authorities and auditors.”.

CUSTOMS DUTY (BERMUDA VETERINARY SERVICES) REMISSION ORDER 2014
BR 62 / 2014
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The Minister of Finance, in exercise of the power conferred by section 2 of the Customs Duty (Special Remission) Act 1951, makes the following Order:

Citation
1 This Order may be cited as the Customs Duty (Bermuda Veterinary Services)Remission Order 2014.

Interpretation
2 In this Order—

“goods” means building material, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment (other than construction equipment)—

(a) which are imported into Bermuda in connection with the renovation and refurbishment of the undertaking by BVS Limited; and

(b) which have a rate of duty, as specified in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act 1970, of more than 10% of the value of the goods;

“undertaking” means the veterinary clinic and hospital at No. 1 The Lane, Paget.

Exempted person
3 (1) BVS Limited is an exempted person for the purposes of this Order and the Customs Duty (Special Remission) Act 1951.

(2) BVS Limited is hereby granted partial exemption from the payment of import duty on the goods imported by them or their agents, provided such goods are used, or intended to be imported or used, in connection with the undertaking.

Rate of duty
4 The rate of duty to be paid on the goods imported pursuant to this Order is 10% of the value of the goods.

Commencement and expiration
5 (1) This Order is deemed to have come into operation on 24 June 2014 and expires on 31 March 2019.

(2) At the expiration of this Order, goods on which import duty has been paid at the rate specified in paragraph 4 shall not be subject to import duty by reason only that this Order has ceased to have effect.
