REGISTERED NURSE

SPECIAL CARE BABY UNIT (SCBU)

Key responsibilities include:

- Gives direct patient care (neonates)
- Assesses client/patient and family needs, formulates care plan in accordance with established nursing diagnoses, executes interventions, and evaluates outcomes
- Consults with all members of the multidisciplinary team about patients' status and progress. Ensures that the Clinical Manager / Nurse in Charge are kept abreast of changes and problems related to assigned patients
- Functions as a team leader when required. Utilizes clinical, hospitals and community resources. Participates in unit Quality Improvement activities and when required, approved research projects
- Functions as a preceptor/monitor and role model for new junior staff, as well as peer
- Uses equipment and supplies in a safe and economical manner
- Participates in committees, attends staff meetings, in-services and educational programs
- Takes active responsibility for professional growth and development
- Performs added nursing and delegated medical acts as required

Qualifications &/ Registration required:

- Registered Nurse with Bachelor's Degree or Diploma from an accredited institution
- Current registration with the Bermuda Nursing Council, as required
- Minimum of two years post grad experience as a Neonatal Nurse
- Current certifications: CPR, I.V. Neonatal Resuscitation Programme (NRP)
- Neonatal Nurse Certificate would be an Asset
- Experience in Physical assessment essential
- Demonstrated knowledge and clinical competencies

Some of these positions are being advertised prior to contract renewals with a view to attracting suitably qualified Bermudians, PRC Holders, Divorced Parent of a Bermudian Child or Non-Bermudian with a qualifying Bermudian connection. Registration with Bermuda Nursing Council is mandatory.

PSYCHIATRIC STAFF NURSES (FULL, PART-TIME AND CASUALS):

Key responsibilities include:

- Assesses service user's mental, physical and emotional care needs and develops care plans to meet those needs
- Communicates and works with care teams to establish comprehensive treatment plans consistent with the needs of the service user and keeps the psychiatrist informed of the service user's condition and progress

Qualifications &/ Registration required:

- RN, RMN, RNMH, Graduate of a 3 or 4 year Psychiatric Nursing Education Program or an 18 month Post Graduate Psychiatric course approved by the Bermuda Nursing Council.
- Minimum of 2 years post- registration experience of working in Psychiatric Nursing

GENERAL NURSES (FULL, PART-TIME AND CASUALS):

Key responsibilities include:

- Assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of client/ patient plan of care
- Coordination and direction of nursing care utilizing the nursing process
- Functioning as a member of a collaborative care team to achieve patient/ client outcomes

Qualifications &/ Registration requirements:

- Graduate of an accredited Nursing program recognized by the Bermuda Nursing Council, minimum two (2) years post graduate nursing experience
- Current registration with the Bermuda Nursing Council is required
- BCLS certification
- Certification in specialty area required

Closing date for applications is: October 6, 2015. Pre-employment substance abuse screening is mandatory for all successful candidates
