- Providing supervision and delegation of specific written treatment plans to aides, assistants, and/or students
- Observing and evaluating treatment effects and communicates patient progress or lack thereof to appropriate staff and physicians
- Maintaining patient documentation using the appropriate paper work.
- Preparing specific clinical reports as requested

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university required with certification, if applicable, in jurisdiction of training

- Flexibility and creativity to accommodate the needs of the patients, carers and Rehabilitation Team
- Commitment to clinical standards of care, personal and professional growth, and improvement of Occupational Therapy services within the hospital
