2	Tender Service to cruise ships is subject to a minimum of— (a) three round trips for the first twelve hour period; and (b) five round trips in any twenty-four hour period.
3	Except in the case of dues specified in Part IV of the Schedule, all charges are subject to a 100 per cent surcharge— (a) on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays; and (b) between 1630 hours and 0800 hours on normal working days. ”.

ELECTRICITY (REGULATORY AUTHORITY FEES) REGULATIONS 2018	
BR 21 / 2018	
The Minister responsible for energy, for the purpose of establishing Regulatory Authority fees for the electricity sector pursuant to the Electricity Act 2016, in exercise of the power conferred by section 44 of the Regulatory Authority Act 2011, makes the following Regulations:	
Citation	
1	These Regulations may be cited as the Electricity (Regulatory Authority Fees) Regulations 2018.
Schedule of fees payable	
2	(1) In respect of the items specified in the Schedule, there shall be paid the Regulatory Authority fee specified in relation to each such item. (2) The fees payable under paragraph (1) shall be payable to the Regulatory Authority.
Dedicated charge	
3	The Electricity Transmission, Distribution and Retail Service Provider may recover from the end-user the fees payable under paragraph (1) of the Schedule by a dedicated charge on the end-user.
Revocation of 2017 Regulations	
4	The Electricity (Regulatory Authority Fees) Regulations 2017 are revoked.
Commencement	
5	These Regulations come into operation on 1 April 2018.
