The Legal Counsel works under the direction of the Executive Officer of the Human Rights Commission and is accountable for the provision of expert legal services and technical advice including; legal opinions related to specific issues arising from complaints made to the Commission and the litigation of cases referred for adjudication in the public interest. The post-holder is also accountable for the effective representation of the Commission's interest before Human Rights Tribunals and the Bermuda Courts.

Applicants must either be a member of the Bermuda Bar Association in good standing or be qualified as a Barrister and Attorney of a Commonwealth jurisdiction, possess an LLB, preferably with a specialization in Human Rights or Constitutional Law and have a minimum of five years' experience dealing with administrative, constitutional and/or human rights law, case management and alternative dispute resolution processes, including two years litigation experience before the Supreme Court or before a comparable Court in another Commonwealth jurisdiction. The successful candidate will possess excellent knowledge of the Human Rights Act 1981, the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1935 and have sound knowledge of relevant legislation and international human rights conventions as well as Bermuda's jurisprudence.
