Lowe then fired an Angelo Simmons rebound into an open net but the goal was ruled offside. He then wasted two glorious opportunities. Town enjoyed a good spell in the second half but were again unable to penetrate the Zebras defence.

PHC substitute Kenneth Matthie had the ball in the net but the effort was ruled offside. By now, a rampant Zebras were all over their opponents and it came as no surprise when Ming killed the game off six minutes from time with a low drive.

"Unfortunately the result doesn't allow us to go through to the next round," Cal Blankendal, the Town assistant coach, said.

"The first 45 minutes we were very good, but the second 45 we never really got started."
