The Statistician works under the direction of the Director to manage and control surveys and other statistical enquiries within the broad area of economic statistics. The post-holder undertakes in-depth research and analyses of socio-economic data and provides statistical advice and professional consultancy to other Government Departments involved in the collection, processing, analysis and presentation of economic data.

Applicants must possess a Master's Degree or equivalent in Sociology, Business, Economics, Mathematics, Statistics or a related subject area, involving formal training in quantitative research and analysis techniques. Must have a minimum of three years' post-qualification experience, preferably in a Government statistical environment. A certificate of formal training in supervisory management is also required.
