Magnificent Blackwood shines for West Indies

- West Indies beat England by four wickets on the final day of the first international Test since the Covid-19 break yesterday, taking a 1-0 lead at the Ageas Bowl in a three-Test series thanks to a 95-run knock by Jermaine Blackwood.

England made early inroads into the West Indies batting line-up on day five as the visiting side targeted 200 to win, reducing them to 27 for three before Blackwood began to set the foundations for a big win for the Caribbean side, albeit behind closed doors.

When opener John Campbell retired hurt after a toe-crushing yorker from Jofra Archer, Blackwood came in before lunch and began to anchor the innings, sharing a 73-run stand with Roston Chase (37).

"It was a nerve-racking start after losing quick three wickets and Campbell to injury," Windies captain Jason Holder said. "But Roston and Jermaine put on a good partnership and settled the nerves. From there we could build on.

"I missed the Barmy Army but it was a level playing field

without the crowds. It's been a good start back to international cricket, it sets the series up quite

The Barbados-born Archer, who finished with three for 45,

troubled the batsmen throughout with his pace and bounce but England were unable to dismiss the danger man Blackwood.

In the end the 28-year-old Jamaican narrowly missed out on

his second Test century when he tried to lift a Ben Stokes delivery over the infield, only to gift James Anderson a catch.

Campbell then returned to the crease with West Indies six wickets down to join Holder, who played a patient knock of 14 off 36 balls, to guide the West Indies home in the final session.

Earlier, England were bowled out for 313 in their second innings after resuming on 284 for eight, with the overnight pair of Archer and Mark Wood failing to offer much resistance.

Shannon Gabriel finished with figures of five for 75 — his sixth five-wicket haul in Tests while Chase and Alzarri Joseph picked up two wickets apiece.

"Ideally we would have liked to have got more runs in the first innings," England captain Stokes said, adding that he stood by his decision to bat first.

"We got ourselves into great positions at times with the bat to kick on and get 350 or 400, and we weren't ruthless enough. We didn't manage to grasp the game as we would have liked."

The second and third Tests will be held in Manchester, also without fans in attendance.

Dominant Hopkins retains time-trial title

Kaden Hopkins triumphed in the Bermuda Bicycle Association's first official event of the year after winning the VT Construction Individual Time-Trial yesterday.

Hopkins, the defending champion and course record holder, had another strong performance in the 10.8-mile race, clocking a time of 23min 9sec with an average speed of 28mph.

Conor White placed second in 24:45 with Alexander Miller coming third as the top junior in 25.15.

Juniors Nic Narraway and Liam Flannery rounded out the top five in 25:22 and 25:30 respectively.

The riders started at Paget Post Office on Middle Road, travelling east to Barnes Corner and turning left onto South Road then continuing on the challenging hilly route finishing opposite the Bermuda College entrance.

With the normal season having been put on hold because of the Covid-19 pandemic, riders and officials were excited to finally get the season under way albeit not normal in many senses of the word, with strict rules of participation in place.

Riders were required to register online through the racedayworld website, which gave each rider an official start time of one minute between riders and limiting contact with the race officials who were required to wear face masks and observe social distances recommendations.

Riders were also required to start with on foot on the ground and not held by an official which would be normal practice.

Despite the restrictions a promising 36 riders participated in hot, humid conditions.

Masters rider Louise Wells was the fastest woman in a time of 28:05 an average speed of 23.1mph.

Open female Jamie-Lee Wright was second in 29:38 and Junior female Liana Medeiros third in 31:51.

In the men's masters category and making a welcome return to competitive cycling was former top Bermuda rider Kris Hedges who put in an impressive display with a time of 27:13. Geoff Smith came second in 27.25 and Neil Lupsic third 28.07.

Other category winners were Jasmin Hasselkuss in the junior girls' 13-14 in a time of 34.14 and Moses Johnson in the junior boys' 15-16 in 29:22. Zac Muniz was first in the junior boys' 11-12 in 48:21.


