CLINICAL PHARMACIST

PHARMACY

Key responsibilities include:

- Receiving, interpreting and evaluating all medication orders for patient specific drug-related problem, following established policies and procedures. Consulting with medical staff/nursing as the need arises
- Dispensing narcotics and assisting with maintaining the perpetual inventory records
- Checking all manufacturing, packaging and dispensing of the technical staff
- Adhering to all IV Room policies and procedures (e.g. preparation, storage, dispensing, cleaning schedule) including working knowledge of aseptic technique and the ability to prepare sterile IV products and chemotherapeutic agents
- Providing drug information to other healthcare professionals
- Providing Clinical Pharmacy services to designated areas as directed by the Pharmacy Manager. Including performing profile checks, medication area inspections and participation in multidisciplinary rounds and consults as required
- Providing coverage for the other BHB pharmacies as the need arises
- Mentoring pharmacy technicians, preregistration pharmacists, undergraduate pharmacist and seconded to the post holder for experience in the area which the post holder is responsible

Qualifications &/ registration required:

- Graduate of a recognized School of Pharmacy
- Post Graduate Clinical Qualification – UK recognized M Clin or US recognized Pharm.D; Clinical residency
- Registered Pharmacist License with the Bermuda Pharmaceutical Association and with the Supplement to Medicine –Bermuda Government
- Minimum of two years of pharmacy experience in a similar hospital setting/position
- Experience in supervising/ mentoring professional and technical staff

Schedule: Participates in a shift rotation to include weekends and public holidays. Hours of work may change to meet the changing demands on the pharmacy services required

Registration with The Bermuda Pharmaceutical Association is mandatory for this position.

MEDICAL TECHNOLOGISTS - GENERAL

LABORATORY

The Medical Technologist performs clinical laboratory analyses on biological specimens providing information for the diagnosis, prevention, or treatment of disease in a safe and effective manner. Technologists will be required to rotate through any facility associated with the Bermuda Hospitals Board and any section where they have experience.

Requirements:

- BSc Degree in Medical Technology or registered technologist with two to five years post qualification experience in Haematology, Biochemistry, Blood Transfusion and Microbiology.
- Must be registered with the ASCP, HPC or CSMLS or equivalent

Schedule: Technologists will be expected to provide optimal coverage of the laboratory services over a 24 hour period, 7 days a week including public holidays. This includes on call coverage.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST (FULL- TIME)

ALLIED HEALTH SERVICES (KEMH & MWD)

Key responsibilities include:

- Meeting productivity standards set by the department for direct patient contact and other related non-patient contact duties
- Performing an appropriate assessment on all in and/or outpatients following referral; use objective clinical measures to identify problems and formulate treatment plans based on realistic stated goals; carry out specific therapeutic interventions as indicated
- Supervising and delegating specific written treatment plans to aides, assistants, and/or students
- Observing and evaluating treatment effect; communicating patient progress or lack of to appropriate staff and physicians
- Maintains patient documentation using the appropriate paper work, ensuring documentation meets current standards and policies; prepares specific clinical reports as requested
- Keeps accurate and timely statistics of both direct and indirect time spent and prepares specific clinical reports as required

Qualifications &/ Registration required:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university required with certification, if applicable, in jurisdiction of training
- 1 – 2 years post-graduate experience in a related Occupational Therapy environment, preferably within a hospital
- Local registration to practice with the Council for Allied Health Professions (CAHP)
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills; liaison with other members of the multidisciplinary team to ensure continuity of care

Registration with the Council for Allied Health Professionals is mandatory for this position.

Closing date for applications is: 19 August 2020. Pre-employment substance abuse screening is mandatory for all successful candidates.
