First Officer

Bermuda Sloop Foundation is seeking an enthusiastic and innovative individual to fulfil the role of First Officer. The ideal candidate will be responsible for the oversight and development and training of the Ship's crew onboard STV - Spirit of Bermuda.

Reporting to the Captain, the First Officer is responsible for the efficient and effective day-to-day management of the crew, students, and activities, while maintaining ship duties.

Key Duties and Responsibilities

- Responsible for day-to-day management of crew, students, and activities.
- Identify and facilitate Watch Leader training and development.
- Assists in establishing a development plan for uprising Mariners with the long-term goal of a full Bermudian crew.
- Responsible for convening regular crew meetings to discuss issues (maintenance, safety, program, etc.)
- From time to time serves as an OOW (Officer of the Watch in charge of deck, and operation of the ship) at times on local voyages - regularly serve as OOW, following watch schedule, on offshore voyages.
- Under direction of Captain, sets ship schedules and assigns work to ship's crew both at sea and alongside. Oversees all deck operations and maintenance, supervision, and administrative and safety duties on board.
- Maintains and monitors all safety equipment through continuous safety inspections (recorded monthly in white "Safety Equipment Checklist" binder) and serve as the vessel's Safety Officer.
- Ensures all crew and passengers are briefed in the use of all safety equipment and in emergency proceedings.
- Continuously reviews the vessel's condition and maintenance schedule and prioritizes maintenance projects; maintains the "Deck Planned Maintenance Schedule".
- Responsible for vessel upkeep; deck, rig, sails, and accommodation.
- Ensures documentation of all deck related maintenance and repair line replacements, block & winch servicing, sail repairs or replacement, etc.
- Ensures correct charts are aboard for every voyage (paper and electronic). Works with the Director of Education and Programs and/or the Senior Educator to develop school voyage itineraries.

Minimum Qualifications and Experience

- Diploma from an accredited maritime training school or facility.
- Minimum two (2) years' experience in similar or subordinate position on board a ship and up to date experience of all current navigational electronics and computerized equipment.
- Holds minimum MCA Yacht Master Offshore (Yacht Master Ocean preferred) or USCG 200-ton Ocean Mate (Master preferred) or equivalent acceptable to Bermuda Maritime Administration.
- STCW, GMDSS endorsements required WFR or EMT/ Paramedic preferred Substantial experience on Sail Training /Tall Ship.
- Marine Radio Operator's Permit or GMDSS preferred.
