The Bermuda Weather Service is a 24/7 operation and applicants must be prepared to work 12-hour rotating shifts including nights, weekends, and public holidays.

Shortlisted applicants will go through a detailed security vetting process and must be able to obtain a Skyport Restricted Airside Pass.
