EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

The Women's Resource Centre has always been shaped by the voices and needs of women in our community — and FY24–25 was a year of extraordinary growth and evolution.

Our client intake nearly tripled, rising from 36 admissions in FY24 to 97 in FY25. The hours of counselling provided increased more than threefold — from 137 to 529 — reflecting both the growing demand for our services and the deep commitment of our clinical team to meeting that need with compassion and excellence.

This expansion extended well beyond our therapeutic services. In alignment with our strategic focus on supporting women in transition, the Centre broadened its reach and deepened its impact through innovative community initiatives, including Community Birthing Classes (in partnership with the It Takes a Village Foundation), the HERstory Women's History Festival, a collaboration with EmPowerMe Bermuda, and the launch of new community wellness initiatives. Together, these efforts have created meaningful avenues for connection, healing, and growth — reaffirming our belief that transformation flourishes when women are provided with safe spaces to gather, reflect, and thrive.

Our evolution this year was both intentional and informed. Following a 2023 community needs assessment, WRC identified key gaps affecting women in Bermuda, including access to affordable housing, nutritious food, mental health care, legal advocacy and practical education. Our internal data reinforced these findings, with 41.5% of client requests in FY25 related to mental health, 25.2% to

legal matters, and 15.5% to financial hardship. In response, we have expanded our service model to offer a more integrated approach, combining counselling and therapeutic support with legal advocacy, hardship assistance, skills development, and mentorship — recognising that women's wellbeing depends on the stability of their social, economic, and emotional lives.

As we move forward, we remain guided by the lived experiences of women in our community. Our growth is not simply about numbers — it is about relevance, responsiveness, and resilience. Together, we are building a Centre that evolves with the needs of women, ensuring that every woman who walks through our doors finds the support, resources, and hope she needs to write her next chapter.

OUR MISSION:

The Women's Resource Centre exists to advance the rights, well-being and equity of women in Bermuda.

Our mission reflects both who we are and what we do: a safe space for healing, a trusted voice for equity, and a connector of women to the resources they need to thrive.

ABOUT US:

The Women's Resource Centre (WRC) has been a trusted voice and support system for women in Bermuda since 1987. Originally founded as the Rape Crisis Centre, our work began with a focus on crisis intervention for survivors of sexual violence. Over nearly four decades, our role has evolved in response to the shifting needs of the community and the broader landscape of women's support services.

In 2015, we transitioned away from direct crisis response, formally transferring our crisis intervention services to the Centre Against Abuse. This pivotal shift marked the beginning of a new era for WRC—one centred on long-term support, personalised case management, and therapeutic intervention.

Today, we provide holistic, traumainformed services designed to meet
women where they are and walk
alongside them as they navigate life's
challenges. Our core offerings include
free counselling, case management,
legal advocacy, wellness support, and
educational workshops. We work
intentionally to remove barriers to care
by offering services without co-pays or
insurance requirements.

As Bermuda's only female-focused non-profit of its kind, our work is grounded in the belief that when women are adequately supported, they can build safe, stable, and fulfilling lives. From emotional healing to practical assistance, WRC creates space for women to reclaim their stories, strengthen their wellbeing, and move forward with confidence—on their own terms.

We are proud of what we've accomplished in FY25 and are energised by the path ahead. With clear priorities and a community-driven approach, we are well-positioned to deepen our reach, refine our impact, and strengthen our role as a vital resource for women across Bermuda.

MISSION DRIVEN

At the Women's Resource Centre we support and advocate for the wellbeing of women in Bermuda through traumainformed services, community education, and systemic advocacy.

Our mission reflects a deep and ongoing commitment to helping women access the tools, care, and support they need to move through hardship and toward healing.

We fulfil this mission through a range of core services — including no-copay counselling, peer support groups, holistic case management, legal advocacy, and educational workshops — all designed to meet women where they are and respond holistically to their needs. Whether navigating trauma, legal challenges, or everyday stressors, women receive compassionate, client-centred care at every stage.

As we continue to evolve, our focus remains clear: to provide services that are not only accessible but also intentional, trauma-informed, and aligned with the lived experiences of the women we serve.

We believe that when women are fully supported, they create ripple effects of healing and stability that benefit families. communities, and generations to come.









ADVOCACY IN ACTION:

Between April 1 2024 and March 31, 2025, the Women's Resource Centre responded to 977 individual requests for support from women across Bermuda.

These requests reflect the most pressing challenges facing women in our community, and the areas where our services and advocacy are most urgently needed.

These figures reflect more than just statistics — they tell a story of women seeking help, resources, and hope.

At WRC, each request is met with compassion and a commitment to walking alongside women on their journey toward safety, stability, and healing.

Mental Health:



Nearly half of all requests were for counselling or therapeutic support, showing the urgent need for safe spaces where women can heal and build resilience.

Legal:



One quarter of all WRC support requests involved custody, divorce, or other legal issues, underscoring the need for accessible, affordable legal guidance for women.

Financial:



Women frequently contacted WRC in need of hardship support such as food, utility support and essential living vouchers, reflecting the financial pressures women are facing in our current economy.

Abuse:



Nearly 8% of requests related directly to domestic or sexual abuse and harassment, reinforcing the ongoing urgency of coordinated responses to Bermuda's abuse epidemic.

Housing:



Safe, affordable housing remains a major challenge for women, especially mothers of young children, with many seeking stability and security for their families.

The impact of the Women's Resource Centre extends far beyond the individual women we serve. When women are supported, families thrive, communities strengthen, and cycles of trauma and instability begin to break.

Every counselling session, support group, or referral creates a ripple effect - fostering resilience, connection, and long-term change. At WRC, we are not only investing in women—we are investing in the future of our entire community.

THERAPETUIC SERVICES

Counselling, Support Groups & Wellness Events

At the heart of the Women's Resource Centre is our commitment to creating safe, supportive spaces where women can heal, grow, and thrive. Our therapeutic services are designed to meet women where they are — whether that means navigating life transitions, processing trauma, or strengthening emotional wellbeing.

Through counselling, peer support, and wellness events, we provide women with the guidance, support, and connection they need to build healthier, more resilient lives.

HOW WE SERVE:

Individual Counselling

We provide women with access to private, confidential sessions with trained counsellors to address and manage mild to moderate mental health challenges, including anxiety, depression, grief, postpartum depression, and posttraumatic stress disorder. Counselling also offers valuable support for women navigating major life transitions or healing from past trauma.

Support Groups

Our peer support groups connect women with shared lived experiences, creating a safe and supportive space where they can be heard and understood. From grief support to mothers' groups, these circles foster connection, safety, and relatability.

Wellness Events

We regularly host wellness workshops and events that equip women with practical tools to strengthen their mental and emotional wellbeing, supporting healthier and more balanced lives.

IN THEIR OWN WORDS: The Living Impact of Our Work

The true measure of our impact isn't just in the numbers—it's in the women who walk through our doors and into healing, stability, and renewed strength. Their stories are powerful reminders that our work is living, breathing, and moving throughout our community every single day.

These voices reflect what we already know to be true: when women are supported without judgment or barriers, they transform not only their own lives but the lives of their families and the communities around them. At the Women's Resource Centre, we are redefining what support looks like—making space for women to be seen, heard, and held with care.

2025 INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

On March 7, 2025, the Women's Resource Centre proudly hosted our annual International Women's Day (IWD) Celebration at Pier 6 in Hamilton. This year's event welcomed 280 attendees and embraced the global theme, "Accelerate Action."

The celebration honoured the remarkable achievements of women in our community while shining a light on the importance of equity, representation, and collective progress.

We were thrilled to name Lisa Lister-Reed as Bermuda's 2025 Woman of the Year. A trailblazer in finance, government consulting, and human rights, Lisa has spent decades advocating for policy reform, disability rights, and community mentorship. Her unwavering commitment to inclusion and social justice has strengthened Bermuda's human rights framework and created lasting opportunities for underrepresented communities.

All funds raised through our International Women's Day celebration directly support the WRC's Advocacy Programme, helping to advance our public education and awareness initiatives that drive systemic change on the social issues disproportionately affecting women.











1ST ANNUAL PURPLE THURSDAY GALA

On October 17, 2024, the Women's Resource Centre proudly hosted its first-ever Purple Thursday Gala at the Hamilton Princess & Beach Club. bringing together over 130 quests in a powerful show of solidarity with survivors of domestic abuse. The event aligned with the global Purple Thursday campaign and served as both a fundraiser and a call to action—raising awareness about domestic violence and mobilising support for those affected.

In the room were advocates, health care providers, legislators, law enforcement officers, survivors, and community supporters - all standing united in the shared belief that every woman deserves safety, dignity, and the opportunity to rebuild. The evening featured a deeply moving "Empty Chair" ceremony to honour lives lost to domestic violence. followed by a keynote address from Tawana Tannock, who spoke powerfully about the importance of advocacy, justice reform, and the urgent need to recognise coercive control and emotional abuse under the law.

With the support of generous sponsors and partners, the gala raised critical funds for WRC's Hardship Fund, which provides therapeutic, legal, and practical assistance to women in crisis. The success of this inaugural event not only amplified the voices of survivors —it also laid the foundation for an annual tradition rooted in remembrance. resilience, and collective action.

























HERSTORY Women's History Month Festival

On March 29, 2025, the Women's Resource Centre brought the streets of St. George's to life with its first-ever HERstory Festival. This free, family-friendly event featured a vibrant mix of historical tours, cultural workshops, artisan showcases, and live performances, celebrating the stories, creativity, and contributions of Bermudian women.

Curated by Kristin White of Long Story Short, the festival welcomed community members, artists, historians, and entrepreneurs into a dynamic and immersive experience that honoured women's history while creating space for joy, connection, and community pride.

The day concluded with music and literary performances that captured the heart of the event, amplifying women's voices and strengthening the bonds that unite us.

The HERstory Festival marked the beginning of a new tradition rooted in celebration, reflection, and collective empowerment.















COMMUNITY **PARTNERSHIPS**

In November 2024, WRC transferred our Transformational Living Centre programme to our community partner, HOME.

This third-sector collaboration reflects our commitment to collective action and ensures continued, coordinated support for women, while allowing WRC to focus more deeply on our core therapeutic and advocacy programmes.
